The Portchester Civic Society Some of our activities....



Planning issues affecting Portchester, both local and national, are closely followed and representations made to the Council and other interested parties to ensure a high standard of planning and architecture in the area.

Monthly meetings are held where members are updated on the current work of the Society and entertained with talks and walks of local interest.

Social Activities are arranged for members and guests such as Skittles and Quiz evenings and a Christmas Party.

The Society adopted an area at the bottom of Birdwood Grove where members planted trees and wild flowers to enhance the environment. with countryside rangers from Fareham Borough Council.

Members take part in the annual **MCS BeachClean** event, **clearing litter** from the Portchester foreshore.

An annual, week long **exhibition of photographs** of Portchester past is put on in the foyer of the Library/Health Centre.

Our **'Memories of Portchester'** exhibition is presented in the Parish Hall annually where photographs, paintings, books and memorabilia of Portchester are displayed.

The Society published a book 'Portchester in Living Memory' as an outcome of its Oral History Project when over 60 residents of Portchester were interviewed on their memories of the area. This project received generous funding assistance from the Heritage Lottery Fund and Fareham Borough Council.

The Society has a large and expanding collection of old **photographs** of Portchester.

We publish an annual **'Portchester Matters'** newsletter which is distributed free to our members.

In St Mary's churchyard in the Castle, the grave of **Thomas Goble**, last Secretary of the Fleet to Nelson at the Battle of Trafalgar, was restored by the Society and re-dedicated in the bi-centennial of the battle, 2005.

Donations have been made to Portchester AFC for floodlighting, the Community School bands, Castle Primary's courtyard garden and St Mary's Church for the World War 2 memorial plaque.

The Society also helped put on and fund a community play in 2009, 'Between the Hill and the Sea', which used as its basis stories from our oral history recordings.

In 2016 we supported the publication of Bryan Jerrard's book '**Portchester, A Community History**'.
